The Big Sit! 2013

Looking for a different kind of birding experience? Consider taking part in the annual "Big Sit," which will occur on October 12-13 this year. This is a non-competitive event sponsored by Birdwatcher's Digest every year. Some call it a worldwide tailgate party for birders.

The simplicity of the concept makes The Big Sit! so appealing. Find a good spot for bird watching, preferably with good views of a variety of habitats and lots of birds. Next you create a real or imaginary circle 17 feet in diameter and sit inside the circle for 24 hours, counting all the bird species you see or hear. That's it. Find a spot, sit in it and have fun.
